Health Services	There are reports of damage to the roof of the Psychiatric Hospital on mainland Grenada. The roof is currently being repaired. Five of the six health facilities in Carriacou have been damaged are unable to be used to provide services. The roof at the Princess Royal Hospital in Carriacou is damaged. The Services have been moved to the Hillsborough Health Center. Medical emergencies are transferred to Grenada by boat or aircraft. An international organization has offered to erect a level 2 hospital on Carriacou. A team of health care providers will travel to Carriacou on a daily basis beginning on July 4 to provide services.
	Mainland Grenada has recorded 1 death. Carriacou has recorded 2 deaths. Petite Martinique has recoded 0 death.
Emergency Shelters	Thirteen (13) Emergency Shelters are activated. Three hundred and eighty three (383) people are in Shelters.
Education	The Minister of Education has announced that Schools will remain closed for the term.
Transport/Road Clearance	Roads have been restored on mainland Grenada. There is still some clearing of trees and slides to be completed in the north of the island.
Special area of focus	Carriacou and Petite Martinique have been severely impacted. Initial reports suggest 99 % of the housing stock either damaged or destroyed. significant damage to the housing stock.
