NATURE OF EVENT:	<p>At 11:00 a.m., June 29, 2024, Grenada and its dependencies were placed under Hurricane Watch.</p> <p>At 8:00 p.m., June 29, 2024, Grenada and its dependencies were placed under Hurricane Warning.</p> <p>July 1st, 9:00 a.m., Hurricane Beryl impacted Grenada, Carriacou and Petite Martinique with the eye passing close to or over Carriacou.</p> <p>The Northern half of Grenada and islands of Carriacou and Petite Martinique were significantly impacted.</p> <p>On the islands of Carriacou and Petite Martinique, there is no electricity or water.</p> <p>Communications is very limited.</p>
Actions Taken	<p>The NEOC remains activated.</p> <p>DEOCs remain activated.</p>

	<p>Shelters remain activated and an assessment is currently being undertaken to ascertain numbers.</p> <p>Grenada wishes to activate the response plan discussed with CDEMA pre-impact.</p> <p>Grenada has requested COST and RNAT support from CDEMA.</p> <p>A state of Emergency was declared as of Sunday June 30, from 7:00 p.m., to 6:59 a.m. on July 7.</p> <p>The State of Emergency was discontinued for Grenada but remains in effect for Carriacou and Petite Martinique.</p> <p>An assessment team which included NaDMA, RGPF and Utility Companies visited Carriacou and Petite Martinique on July 02nd.</p>
Weather Condition	<p>Hurricane conditions experienced throughout the State on Monday, July 1st, 2024. More severe impacts in Carriacou and Petite Martinique.</p>

NEOC Status	<p>Currently Activated</p> <p>Grenada has deployed two persons to provide operational support to the DEOC in Carriacou.</p> <p>A team of persons will travel to Carriacou on July 3 to conduct the detailed damage assessment.</p>
Law Enforcement	<p>The Royal Grenada Police Force continues to provide security services throughout the state. There have been no reports of major incidents.</p>
Water	<p>Water restored to some parts of Mainland Grenada.</p>
Electricity	<p>Electricity restored to some parts of mainland Grenada.</p>
Sea Ports/Airports	<p>The airport and seaport in Grenada are open.</p> <p>The airport in Carriacou is accessible and is accommodating flights.</p> <p>The seaport in Carriacou is accessible and is accepting vessels.</p>
Customs	<p>Customs is functional on Mainland Grenada.</p>
Welfare/Social Services	<p>A three-member team was dispatched to Carriacou to provide psychosocial support.</p>

Health Services	<p>There are reports of damage to the roof of the Psychiatric Hospital on mainland Grenada. The roof is currently being repaired.</p> <p>Five of the six health facilities in Carriacou have been damaged are unable to be used to provide services. The roof at the Princess Royal Hospital in Carriacou is damaged. The Services have been moved to the Hillsborough Health Center.</p> <p>Medical emergencies are transferred to Grenada by boat or aircraft.</p> <p>An international organization has offered to erect a level 2 hospital on Carriacou.</p> <p>A team of health care providers will travel to Carriacou on a daily basis beginning on July 4 to provide services.</p> <p>Mainland Grenada has recorded 1 death.</p> <p>Carriacou has recorded 2 deaths.</p> <p>Petite Martinique has recorded 0 death.</p>
Emergency Shelters	Thirteen (13) Emergency Shelters are activated. Three hundred and eighty three (383) people are in Shelters.
Education	The Minister of Education has announced that Schools will remain closed for the term.
Transport/Road Clearance	Roads have been restored on mainland Grenada. There is still some clearing of trees and slides to be completed in the north of the island.
Special area of focus	Carriacou and Petite Martinique have been severely impacted. Initial reports suggest 99 % of the housing stock either damaged or destroyed. significant damage to the housing stock.
