Nature of Event:	• At 11:00 a.m., June 29, 2024, Grenada and its dependencies were placed under Hurricane Watch.
	• At 8:00 p.m., June 29, 2024, Grenada and its dependencies were placed under Hurricane Warning.
	• At 9:00 a.m., July 1 <sup>st</sup> , 2024, Hurricane Beryl impacted Grenada, Carriacou and Petite Martinique with its centre traversing in proximity to or over Carriacou.
	• The Northern Part of Grenada, as well as the islands of Carriacou and Petite Martinique were significantly impacted.
	• This impact resulted in a total loss of water supply and electricity on both Carriacou and Petite Martinique.
	Communication with Carriacou and Petite Martinique is limited.
Actions Taken	• A State of Emergency was declared as of Sunday June 30, from 7:00 p.m., to 6:59 a.m. on July 7, 2024.

	• The State of Emergency was discontinued for Grenada but remains in effect for Carriacou and Petite Martinique.
	The NEOC remains activated and is coordinating response however, DEOCs were deactivated.
	Shelters remain activated and an assessment is underway to ascertain numbers.
	Grenada has requested COST and RNAT support from CDEMA.
	An Initial Damage Assessment team, comprising of fourteen personnel, is in Carriacou and Petite Martinique conducting assessments.
	• On July 5, 2024, a nine-member team from the CDRU arrived in Grenada, with additional members expected to arrive soon.
	• A seven-member RNAT team and two-member COST arrived in Grenada on July 5, 2024.
	Relief efforts continue throughout Grenada, Carriacou and Petite Martinique.
	• A disaster debris clean-up drive is scheduled for July 6, 2024, in the northern parishes of Grenada.
	• Six members of the CDRU team arrived at Carriacou on July 06, 2024, and would provide assistance with Search and Rescue operations and relief-aid distribution of approximately 909 food packages to the residents.
	• The remaining six CDRU members are assisting with the preparation of food packages at the NaDMA's building.
	• The two-member COST continues to provide support to EOC operations at NaDMA.
	• The RNAT is conducting assessments in the northern parishes of Grenada that were impacted by Hurricane Beryl.

	to erect a level 2 field hospital on Carriacou.
	• A team of health care providers will travel to Carriacou on a daily basis beginning on July 4 to provide services.

Emergency Shelters	<ul> <li>Petite Martinique has recoded 0 death.</li> <li>Thirteen (13) Emergency Shelters are activated in Carriacou. Three hundred and eighty-three (383) people are in Shelters.</li> <li>As of yesterday, July 5, 2024, there are 17 active facilities accommodating 500 shelteres.</li> <li>Assessments by National Shelter Management Committee members identified the urgent need for water for both sanitation and drinking, as well as food. Also, shelter management teams and EOC staff needs to be relieved from the duties via shift change.</li> <li>Members of the National Shelter Management Committee visited the following facilities on Carriacou today, July 6, 2024:         <ul> <li>Dover Govt.
