NaDMA appeals for trucking support to facilitate the Relief Effort

St. George's, Grenada – Wednesday 3rd July 2024.

Following the passage of Hurricane Beryl on Monday, July 1, 2024, efforts are underway to provide emergency supplies to St Patrick, St Andrew, and St Mark the areas in Grenada severely affected by the Hurricane.

The National Disaster Management Agency (NaDMA) has appealed to truck owners and drivers to support the Relief effort, specifically to help deliver urgent aid to residents of communities in the most affected parishes.

According to Deputy Disaster Coordinator, Arthur Pierre, the Agency has increased distribution of food, bottled water, tarpaulins, and medical supplies to ensure that persons affected by Hurricane Beryl receive the assistance they need.

As of Wednesday afternoon, there were eleven (11) emergency centers still operating on the mainland, as residents gradually returned to their homes.

Donations toward the ongoing relief efforts can be dropped off at the NaDMA Headquarters in Morne Jaloux, St George.
